



2022 SENIOR (55+) CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

July 7

Format: **Individual Stroke Play (Gross and Net)**

MEN: WHITE TEES
LADIES: RED TEES

The **SENIOR MEN'S CLUB CHAMPION** will be determined by the player with the lowest gross total playing from the **WHITE TEES**.

The **SUPER SENIOR MEN'S CLUB CHAMPION (70+)** will be determined by the player with the lowest gross total playing from the **WHITE TEES**.

The **SENIOR LADIES CLUB CHAMPION** will be determined by the player with the lowest gross total playing from the **RED TEES**.

The **SUPER SENIOR LADIES CLUB CHAMPION (70+)** will be determined by the player with the lowest gross total playing from the **RED TEES**.

There is an **OVERALL LOW NET CHAMPION** determined by your score minus your handicap.

TIE BREAKER - any of the major low gross awards above will be decided by a **SUDDEN DEATH PLAYOFF**. For net awards, we will use retrogression to determine the winner.

GOLF CANADA RULES APPLY other than the Local Rules outlined below:

LOCAL RULES IN EFFECT ARE:

- 1. Mandatory marking of ball.** - Put an identifying mark on your ball
- 2. No Preferred Lies.** Summer rules are in effect.
- 3. Lost Ball Rule: You have a maximum time of 3 minutes to find your ball once you have reached the suspected area in which you believe your ball to be.** Your ball is declared lost after 3 minutes of looking. Add 2 strokes and drop in the nearest light rough no closer to the hole from the suspected location your group agrees the ball should be.
- 4. Hole 9:** use the drop area located near the green if your ball goes into the penalty area. The railroad ties surrounding the green on Hole 9 are not considered to be in the hazard. You may take relief for stance or swing no nearer the hole. Balls that are in the bunker that are

being interfered by the ties can be dropped in the same bunker one club length no nearer the hole.

5. Area to the left of the fairway on **Hole 13** is marked as a penalty area. For balls resting on the cart path or balls that have entered the penalty areas beside the green, proceed to the nearest drop area. Cart path free drop, penalty area (1) stroke penalty.
6. On **Hole 14**, there is no penalty area to the right of the 14th green however there is a penalty area to the left of the green. Look for the red “penalty area” stakes.
7. On **Hole 15**, for those balls entering the river on the right side of the green or on the cart path, use the nearest drop area closest to the point of entry.
8. Areas of “Ground under Repair “ are indicated with white paint and are labeled GUR.
9. All fence lines are considered “Out of Bounds”. Fence lines are not to be crossed to look for errant balls. This is a safety concern on the holes which have cliffs OB (#7) and electrified fence (#8.) Out of bounds has two options, (1) replay with stroke and distance penalty (or) (2) take a 2 stroke penalty and drop at the nearest point in the fairway from where your ball entered the OB area.
10. **Staked Trees:** Free relief from staked trees (must be staked). Rule 16.1 applies. You only get free relief if the staked tree interferes with your stance or swing, not line of sight.

Please play 2 balls if a ruling is required. Mark the spots where the original ball lies as well as the 2nd ball played and report to the Rules Chairman before signing the score card. After finishing your round, the player must sign his/her scorecard and get it attested by the person keeping his/her score. Players may not win a gross and net prize in the same flight.
